TOM PACIUNION LEARNING GRANT APPLICATION

The Manitoba Teachers' Society is committed to supporting the leadership development and the professional learning of its members. The Tom Paci Union Learning Grant provides the opportunity for teachers to build their knowledge and skills in labour relations and unionism through professional learning opportunities.

This grant is intended to provide mentorship and professional learning opportunities for members to understand their potential paths to leadership roles in their locals.

Applications will be accepted on an ongoing basis and will be considered in two rounds: First round January 30, 2026 and then second round March 31, 2026.

- 1. Applications will be approved until all funds are exhausted.
- 2. The maximum funding will be \$3,000 per applicant.
- 3. Priority will be given to Members who are not released 50% or more at their Locals. and to Members who do not have access to Local professional development funds.
- 4. Funding can be used to cover release time, travel costs, accommodation, and registration fees.
- 5. Applicants will need to provide an outline of proposed activities with estimated costs.
- 6. Priority will be given to Members who have not received funding in the past application intake.
