Students Tasks to Demonstrate Learning (Assessment of Learning) Activate

- 1. Read <u>When We Were Alone</u> by David Alexander Robertson
- 2. Have a class discussion about the text.
- 3. **Empathy Simulation:** The purpose of this simulation is to have student experience on a small scale what if might have been like to have something that was theirs taken from them in an unfair manner.
 - Have students get something they feel they need or like (comforts them).
 - Have students place these objects on a table or in a bin and then cover them.
 - Have a discussion about the thoughts and feelings that come out of the experience.
